

Front 9

Hole 1

Keep your tee shot to the left side of the fairway for the best angle into the green. The green is faster than it looks when putting from back to front.

Hole 2

Longer hitters may have to go at this green in two. A miss to the right side of the green is trouble. This is a tough green which slopes from right to left.

Hole 3

You may not need a driver off the tee. A tee shot of 225 yards down the left side will leave a short iron into the green. Add at least 1 extra club going up the hill.

Hole 4

Shots hit to the left side of the green will feed to the right down the slope.

Hole 5

For those who are big hitters, a tee shot of 235+ yards must be kept down the left side of the fairway to avoid going in the trees on the right. Lay-up shots need to be kept short of the ravine which crosses in front of the green.

Hole 6

This is a difficult green to putt. Shots to the left side of the green will bounce down into the trees.

Hole 7


This hole has a three-tiered green making your approach shot very important. Long left and right is trouble. The only bailout is to be short.

Hole 8

This is a great driving hole down the hill. Out of bounds is to the right of the fairway. The best approach to the hole is from the left side of the fairway.

Hole 9

The farther this pin placement is to the right, the longer the hole plays. This hole typically plays one club shorter for downhill but watch for the wind which is tough to feel from the tee box.



Back 9

Hole 10

Bombs away down this straight away par 4. Keep tee shot to the right side of the fairway for best approach. Add a club for the approach shot up the hill. Green is extremely fast from back to front.

Hole 11

This hole has a great view from the tee box. Typically use two clubs less for the downhill depending on wind direction.

Hole 12

A tee shot down the left side of the fairway sets up a good angle around the dogleg right for the second shot. This hole has a tough multi-tiered green and going over the back of it makes for a tough pitch or chip downhill back onto the green.

Hole 13

A long par 4 with an accessible green. Avoid the fairway bunker off the tee.

Hole 14

Be careful not to hit too much club off the tee. Anything more than 235 yards from the blue tee will go through the fairway into the ravine. Your approach shot should bounce from left to right near the green.

Hole 15

There is a nice view of Suttons Bay off to the right of the tee boxes. Wind can make this hole very tricky.

Hole 16

Risk reward par 5 dogleg right. Long hitters can cut the corner. If you do so, your tee shot must be kept to the right side of the fairway bunker. Any shots hit more than 235 yards directly down the middle from the blue tee boxes will go into the trees. This green tends to be firm.

Hole 17

Risk reward par 4. The safe play is a long iron or fairway wood to the right side of the fairway. This fairway slopes hard from right to left.

Hole 18

A tee shot of 225 yards just left of the fairway bunker from the blue tee sets up an uphill approach to the green. Add an extra club for the uphill approach.
